**ORDINANCE NO. 3276**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF BLOOMFIELD, MISSOURI, BY ADDING NEW SECTIONS WHICH NEW SECTIONS SHALL BE DESIGNATED AS SECTION 100.120: NON-SUFFICIENT FUNDS CHARGES AND SECTION 100.130: METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR DEPOSITS:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF BLOOMFIELD, STODDARD COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Municipal Code of the City of Bloomfield, Missouri, is hereby amended by adding a new Section which new Section shall be designated as Section 100.120: Non-sufficient Funds Charges and shall read as follows:

**SECTION 100.120: NON-SUFFICIENT FUNDS CHARGES**

In the event a check payable to the City of Bloomfield is returned for non-sufficient funds, the payor shall be charged the bank fee assessed to the City of Bloomfield by the bank for the returned check along with the sum of \$20.00 for additional administrative time and expenses incurred as a result of the check being returned for non-sufficient funds. Also, if a payor has a check returned for non-sufficient funds, such payor shall no longer be allowed to make payments to the City of Bloomfield by check and will be required to pay by cash, money order, cashier's check, credit card or debit card.

Section 2. The Municipal Code of the City of Bloomfield, Missouri, is hereby amended by adding a new Section which new Section shall be designated as Section 100.130: Method Of Payment For Deposits and shall read as follows:

**SECTION 100.130: METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR DEPOSITS**

All deposits required by the City of Bloomfield shall be paid by cash, money order, cashier's check, credit card, or debit card only. No checks will be accepted.


